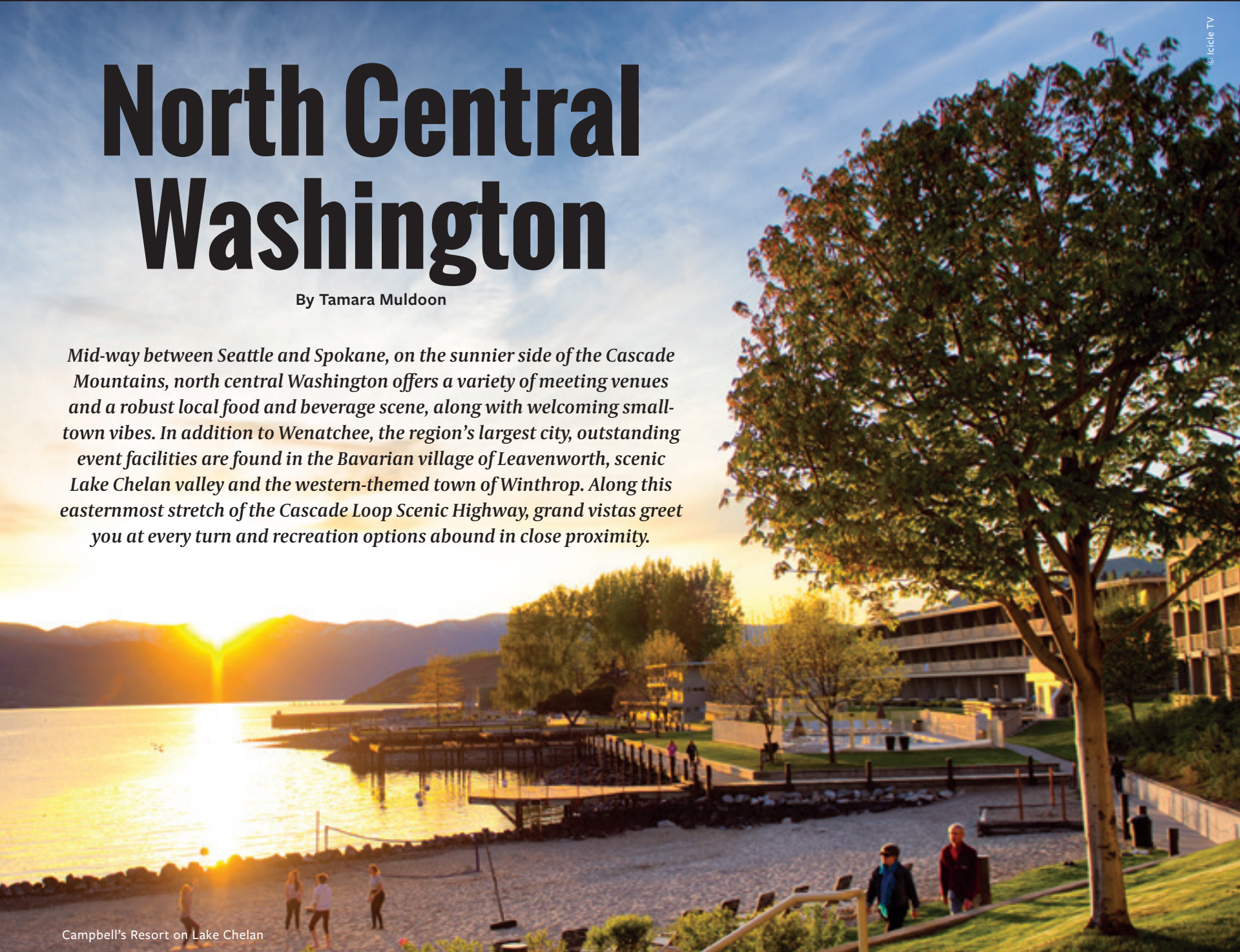


North Central Washington

Mid-way between Seattle and Spokane, on the sunnier side of the Cascade Mountains, north central Washington offers a variety of meeting venues and a robust local food and beverage scene, along with welcoming small-town vibes. In addition to Wenatchee, the region's largest city, outstanding event facilities are found in the Bavarian village of Leavenworth, scenic Lake Chelan valley and the western-themed town of Winthrop. Along this easternmost stretch of the Cascade Loop Scenic Highway, grand vistas greet you at every turn and recreation options abound in close proximity.

Chelan

Visitors come to Chelan for its scenery, recreation and wineries; qualities that also make it a delightful meeting destination.

MEET AND STAY

What began as the 16-room Chelan Hotel in 1901, has been lovingly nurtured into the 8-acre Campbell's Resort by five generations of the Campbell family who still operate the property today. With 170 guest rooms and 14,000 square feet of meeting space, Campbell's is the area's premier full-service conference center.

This lakefront resort offers a private beach, swimming pools, hot tubs and day spa. Accommodations range from spacious, well-equipped hotel rooms to family suites—all with fabulous lake views. Although Chelan's many restaurants are just blocks away, guests often venture no further than Campbell's Pub & Veranda, open morning to night serving the best of local cuisine and beverages.

OUT AND ABOUT

One hour north of Wenatchee, Chelan resides at the foot of fjord-like, 50-mile-long Lake Chelan. Water sports such as boating, swimming, water skiing, kayaking and paddle boarding are popular pursuits. Other activities include hiking, mountain biking, fishing and golf.

Looking for a thrill? How about parasailing above Lake Chelan or soaring along one of the fastest zip line courses in North America? For a more relaxing option, take the Lady of Lake excursion for an unforgettable scenic cruise, or visit some of the nearly 30 nearby wineries.

Wenatchee

Wenatchee accommodates large and small groups with its many venues. The area's agricultural bounty translates into great culinary and beverage offerings. Its proximity to two rivers and the Cascade Mountains guarantees plenty of nearby recreation options.

"A successful meeting starts with the right venue choice, and we are fortunate here in the Wenatchee Valley to have something special to offer. Not only can you stroll along the Columbia River within minutes of the Convention Center, you are in the middle of our historic downtown with unique and unhurried shopping and dining experiences," states Jerri Barkley of Wenatchee Valley Chamber of Commerce.



MEET AND STAY

Wenatchee Convention Center hosts large meetings with ease, offering 28,000 square feet comprised of two large ballrooms and 14 flexible breakout rooms. The Center is city-owned but operated by Coast Hotels Inc., which also manages the adjoining 147-room Coast Wenatchee Center Hotel.

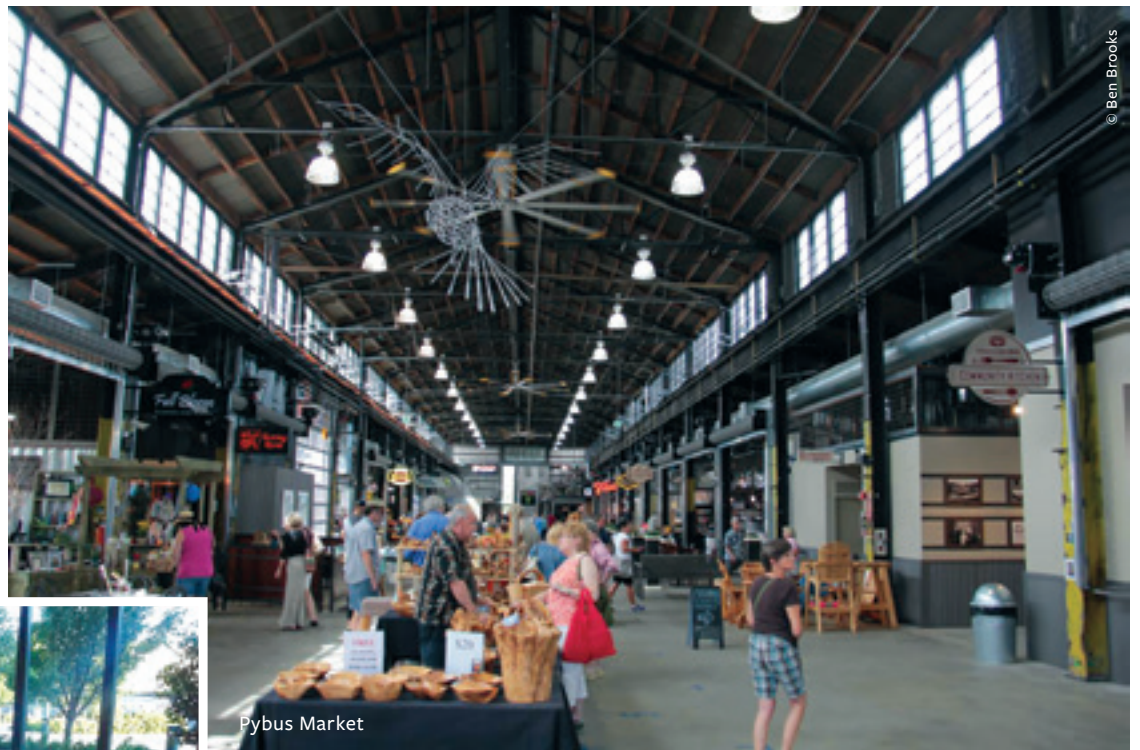
At Red Lion Hotel Wenatchee, experience the convenience of meeting space and lodging in one well-equipped facility. This full-service property contains a ballroom of 5,734 square feet plus generously-sized breakout rooms. Guests enjoy the on-site lounge, fitness center and seasonal pool.

Each of the ten meeting rooms at the Confluence Technology Center (CTC) come with integrated audiovisual equipment controlled from "smart" podiums. Tele- and video-conferencing capabilities, on-site technicians, plus a computer lab with 25 work stations, make CTC ideal for groups with heavy technology needs.

Although the 4,200-seat Town Toyota Events Center arena was designed for sporting and entertainment events, the facility rents the arena floor to private groups for large meetings and trade shows. Three smaller spaces are perfect for corporate or social gatherings of up to 100 people. The second-floor Top Shelf Lounge, overlooking Walla Walla Park, is especially welcoming.

Smaller meetings and social groups will enjoy these less conventional venues. The Art-Deco styling of the BPOE Ballroom adds a touch of glamour to meetings or celebrations. With 6,000 square feet of pillar-free space, hardwood flooring, caterer staging area and built-in bar, this unique facility shines for social events.

At Chateau Fair le Pont winery, groups can assemble in an elegant private space with a stone fireplace located adjacent to the tasting room, or they can have



an intimate gathering in the barrel room. A spacious patio, an outdoor garden with expansive views and the in-house Chateau Grill restaurant provide additional options.

The castle-like turret and Craftsman-style decor of the historic Wells House, built in 1909, lend an old-world charm to any event. Broad porches and the surrounding lawn offer inviting outdoor space as well.

One of Wenatchee's top attractions, Pybus Public Market, has a private room seating up to 200 people, a connecting 4,200-square-foot outdoor patio overlooking the Columbia River and a fully-equipped commercial kitchen. Guests enjoy browsing the market shops that offer food products, teas, produce, flowers and gift items along with several restaurants, a winery, brewery and coffee shop.

Another "must-see" attraction, Ohme Gardens, makes the perfect venue for an outdoor event or after-hours reception. Covering a hilltop overlooking the city, Ohme Gardens is a tranquil oasis of evergreen trees, lush plantings, flowers, waterfalls and ponds amid rocky outcroppings. Columbia River and Cascade mountain views make this an unforgettable setting.

OUT AND ABOUT

The region is renowned for its fruit—apples, pears, cherries and more. Stop by local farm stands and discover fresh-picked deliciousness. The family-owned Stemilt Growers retail store, located just north of town, stocks seasonal fruit, produce and Northwest specialty foods.

Plan a team-building outing at Escape Room Wenatchee. Participants gather in a Bavarian-themed room and work together to solve clues and gain their release before the sand in the hourglass runs out.

Experience winter sports at nearby Mission Ridge, cycle the 10-mile Apple Capitol Loop Trail, raft the Wenatchee River, go for a hike or play a round of golf. There is no shortage of fun outdoor activities here.

Located at the junction of Highways 2 and 97, Wenatchee is about a half day's drive from many major northwest cities. Alaska Airlines' Horizon Air serves Pangborn Memorial Airport in East Wenatchee. Amtrak's Empire Builder train provides easy access from Seattle or Spokane.

Leavenworth

The Bavarian-themed town of Leavenworth offers a unique setting for meetings. Its alpine setting feels a world away, while an extravaganza of dining, shopping, recreation and entertainment options fill leisure hours.

MEET AND STAY

Sleeping Lady Resort on the edge of town makes the perfect retreat. It feels like summer camp for grown-ups. Everything you need is here—meeting space for up

to 190, luxurious guest cabins, recreation and a spa, all nestled in a fragrant pine forest along the Icicle River. Group packages often include meals, served in the on-site Kingfisher Restaurant & Wine Bar. The Grotto Bar provides a restful setting for after-hours mingling.

It's an easy walk to the town center from Icicle Village Resort. The resort features both hotel and condominium accommodations, all including a complimentary hot breakfast. Two large ballrooms, smaller breakout rooms and inviting outdoor event spaces provide flexible options for groups. In addition to a day spa, amenities include two swimming pools, miniature golf, a sports

court and Activity Center with arcade games.

When not in use for community festivals, the city-owned 10,000-square-foot Leavenworth Festhalle is perfect for larger events. It holds 1,000 theater-style, 950 for banquets or 50 exhibit booths.

OUT AND ABOUT

Wander the charming streets of Leavenworth and browse its shops for unique treasures. Along the way, sample locally made treats including chocolates, cheeses and roasted nuts. Wash them down with a beverage from one of the many wine tasting rooms or craft breweries.

Challenge your team to fly high at Leavenworth Ziplines. Horse-drawn wagon rides, river rafting, cycling, hiking, horseback riding, golfing and snow sports are just some of the activities available in this mountain playground only 30 minutes west of Wenatchee.

Winthrop

For a town of fewer than 500 residents, Winthrop possesses a substantial reputation and name recognition. Its one main street is lined with unique shops, lodging, eateries and watering holes, all linked by old-time wooden boardwalks. Settled in the late 1800s, Winthrop retains its Old West character.

MEET AND STAY

From its mountaintop aerie, Sun Mountain Lodge commands a panoramic view of Winthrop and the Methow Valley. With 112 luxurious rustic-chic rooms and suites, more than 10,000 square-feet of indoor meeting space, plus inviting outdoor venues, Sun Mountain is perfect for smaller groups looking for a retreat-like destination. The full-service resort offers a restaurant, lounge and spa in a spectacular setting. The Activities Shop provides convenient equipment rentals, and the staff can organize group events such as a Cowboy Dinner or winter Sleigh Ride.

OUT AND ABOUT

Two hours north of Wenatchee, the Methow Valley is a popular year-round recreation area. More than 120 miles of interconnected trails serve hikers, bikers and cross-country skiers. Other activities include river rafting, horseback riding and golf. The area is a haven for artists, whose work is featured in local galleries and shops.
