Patrons theatres and excellent acoustics," says Marketing and PR Manager Jen Asebrook. Bigfork Summer Playhouse (bigforksummerplayhouse.com) is starting its 59th season of live professional theater. Popular actor J. K. Simmons is among Playhouse alumni, formerly spending seven seasons acting and directing there.
